

Public transport: Regular train services run from London and many Kent towns to Ramsgate. High Speed services run between London St Pancras and Ramsgate via Ashford, Dover, Canterbury, and Faversham. Trains also run from Charing Cross and London Victoria. 'Plus Bus' tickets are available from most railway stations.




