

When may I say....?

Masses for weddings and their anniversaries

The Mass “For Bride and Bridegroom”	Any 2nd-class day other than a Sunday. When this Mass is prohibited, the Mass of the day may usually be said as a wedding Mass. See guide.
A Mass for a Golden or Silver Wedding Anniversary.	Any 2nd-class day other than a Sunday.

Masses for deaths and their anniversaries

The Funeral Mass	Days of the 2 nd class and some of the 1st, but not during an exposition of the blessed sacrament, and generally not as the only Mass on Candlemas (2 nd February), Ash Wednesday, or the Rogation Days (Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday before the Ascension). See guide.
<p>Mass for the day of a death</p> <p>Mass for the day on which the news of a death is received</p> <p>Mass for the final burial in the church of a body that had already been buried elsewhere</p>	Days of the 2 nd class, but not during an exposition of the blessed sacrament, and generally not as the only Mass on Candlemas or the Rogation Days. See guide.
<p>Mass for the 3rd, 7th, or 30th day after a death or burial</p> <p>Mass of the anniversary of a death or burial, or for the established annual recurrence of a foundation Mass, or for the established annual commemoration of the deceased of some group.</p>	Days of the 3 rd class, but not during an exposition of the blessed sacrament, and generally not as the only Mass on the Rogation Days. See guide.

Votive Masses

A votive Mass of a Saint in today's martyrology.	Days of the 4 th class, and vigil and feast days of the 3 rd class except those marked as privileged.
A votive Mass of a Saint listed in the martyrology, but not under today's date. Any other votive Mass.	Days of the 4 th class
A daily Mass for the dead	Green Ferias
